

FAQs

Q. What types of courses are being offered this year?

The following types of courses are available:

- Full credit courses
- Remedial credit courses
- Math Transfer credit
- Non-credit literacy and math support – Grade 9 and 10

Q. What are the eligible criteria for summer school courses?

- **Full credit** courses are open to all high school students and adults, including students who wish to upgrade passing marks. All course prerequisites apply.
- **Remedial credit** courses are open to students who completed the course during the current school year and earned a final mark of at least 35% but less than 50%.
- **The Math Transfer credit** is open to all students who have successfully completed MFM1P1.
- **Non-credit literacy and math support classes** – Grade 9 and 10 – are open to ESL students and all students in Grades 9 through 12 who have attempted any Math or English credit course at the Grade 9 or 10 level and have not earned a final mark of 60% or more. Some examples:
 - Students who withdrew from a Grade 9 or 10 course prior to completion;
 - Students who are eligible for Grade 9 and 10 Remedial Math and/or English summer school courses;
 - Students who have completed Grade 9 or 10 Math or English with a final mark of 58%, including students who are enrolled in the Math Transfer course.

Q. How do students register for summer school?

This year, students will be requesting courses through e-reg. Students can access the registration process on the website at www.creditprograms.ca. Students will need their TDSB login and password. Information is provided under separate cover so that you can provide instructions to students as necessary.

Q. What happens after a student requests a course through e-Reg? Is the student registered?

Guidance approval is required for all TDSB student registrations. When a student submits a request, the student receives an email confirming the request has been made. The email directs the student to see the guidance counsellor. Guidance counsellors access e-Reg through the Toolkit link in Trillium. NOTE: the icon is currently called e-Reg for e-Learning. Clicking on the icon will take you to the e-Reg site. You will notice that there is now a tab for ConEd. Click on the ConEd tab to view student requests. Please note that e-Reg functions are exactly the same in ConEd and e-Learning. Detailed information is provided separately with the summer school registration information for guidance staff.

Q. What is the deadline for registration for full credit courses?

Thursday, June 26, 2014.

Q. In the past, full credit registration closed earlier. What's changed?

Through e-reg, summer school is scheduled in advance of registration opening. The number of sections for each course is established in April, and the number of seats available in each course at each location is determined. Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. It is anticipated that some courses will fill quickly.

Q. Can VISA students register through e-reg?

Yes. The VISA Fee Student Status form is included as an attachment in the summer school registration information.

Q. What about students who have left our school recently? Can these students still be registered at their home school?

Students who are not currently attending a TDSB school do not have TDSB student accounts and therefore cannot register as TDSB students. There is an online registration process for external applicants on the website.

Q. Isn't it likely that a student who needs to take a remedial course will be turned away due to lack of space?

Summer School has been planned using enrolment data from 2011-2013. There are more seats available for all remedial courses than were booked at maximum enrolment. It is possible that a student may not be able to register for the **timeslot** they prefer.

Q. Is there still a stipend available for data entry?

E-reg eliminates the need for data entry. There is therefore no longer a stipend for this work.

Q. Can I still register a student in Trillium?

No. Con Ed User Ids have been suspended. Registration is through e-reg only.

Q. Will Continuing Education be sending out brochures to schools?

All summer school information is online and at www.creditprograms.ca A brochure is no longer printed.

Q. Will Continuing Education be sending registration forms to schools?

No. All registration is through e-reg. Registration forms are no longer used.

Q. Students used to be given a copy of the registration form to take to the first class as proof of registration. What does a student take to the first class now?

Students receive confirmation of registration via email through e-reg.

Q. What happens if a course is cancelled?

Students will be notified via email any time there is a change to the course they enrolled in. The email may direct students to select a different course and see their guidance counsellor for approval.
